this publication explores current global security issues their development in west africa and their potential impact on regional stability it takes a close look at issues such as terrorism and trafficking climate change and the links between security and development from the 9th to the 15th century arab travellers and observers produced a rich literature in west africa an annotated translation of this body of work is found in corpus of early arabic sources for west african history this title is a simplified form of this corpus for students explores empires of medieval west africa first published in 1968 routledge is an imprint of taylor francis an informa company since independence the west african sub region has been an arena for a number of large scale conflicts and civil wars as well as simmering and low intensity uprisings contrary to perceptions west africa in its post independence history has experienced fewer conflict events and fatalities from conflict than the other sub regions on the continent the turn of the millennium has witnessed the recession of large scale and conventional conflict and it has ushered in new and emerging threats the specters of religious extremism maritime piracy and narcotics trafficking threaten to undermine some of the progress achieved in recent years the challenge of stability and security in west africa critically examines the key drivers of conflict and violence and the way in which they impact the countries of the sub region in addition to emerging threats these drivers include the challenges of youth inclusion migration sub regional imbalances and extractives as well as challenges related to the fragility of political institutions and managing the competition for power reform of the security sector and weakness of institutions related to land management the book explores how the sub region under the auspices of the regional organization ecowas has become a pioneer on the continent in terms of addressing regional challenges the challenge of stability and security in west africa also identifies key lessons in the dynamics of resilience in the face of political violence and civil war drawn from cà te d ivoire liberia and sierra leone that can be useful for countries around the world in similar situations it incorporates knowledge and findings from leading experts and provides insights from academics and development practitioners finally the book identifies possible policy and programmatic responses and directions for policy dialogue at the national and international levels originally published in 1980 and here re issued with an updated preface this book deals with the role of the horse in the societies of west africa during the pre colonial period it traces the history of its introduction and its diffusion within west africa and

examines the problems of maintaining horses in such a harsh environment the use of horses in warfare in analysed but the non military aspects of the west african horse culture are also discussed principally the use of horses as tokens of status and wealth the book includes a review of the decline of the west african horse culture in the 20th century reflecting the passing of a political system based on warfare and slavery provides an analytical framework adapted to the west african context as well as an action framework based on the facts and realities in the field in order to improve the coherence of fisheries policies in west africa this book provides a fascinating summary of african history over 5000 years from the stone age to the classical greek and roman era through the medieval period of the kingdoms of the western sudan and into the colonial era this is far beyond the time span normally covered in history texts and it empowers conton to sweeping conclusions the style and language are simple in this text originally intended for west african secondary school students but the concepts the author explores are universal and still very topical writing from a very definite point of view his reach in space and time is vast drawing on historical evidence from around the globe from ancient classical medieval and pre modern sources and from local oral traditions unafraid of controversy he confidently quotes herodotus account of the early circumnavigation of africa before he describes the slow patient achievement of this objective by the portuguese some 2 000 years later he raises the possibility that the yoruba may have actually come from egypt an advanced civilization which he maintains probably had at least one black community he dwells at length on the great african empires of ghana mali and songhai all the while backing up his history with sources detailed maps and photographic evidence of the rich culture of ancient west africa this book provides a very useful background to the general reader interested in a fuller understanding of the region this brief summarizes nutrition relevant policies strategies and action plans all referred to as competing territorial and economic policies regulating an unstable and unpredictable trajectory creating illegal labour through dual logics of border security and selective labour mobility this book demonstrates that the diverse channels through which people migrate in the modern era are mediated by european states and labour markets which utilise border regimes to control labour and be globally competitive the themes and patterns that emerge in their context of inter generational change present a challenge to the accepted wisdom about the individual and household dynamics of labour migration this book is of interest to students and scholars of migration transnationalism politics security development economics and sociology from the coastal cities of dakar and lagos to the grassy savannas and lush steamy rain forests of the countryside west africa cultivates flavors that will delight your taste buds this book examines the role of the economic community of west african states ecowas practitioners in coordinating creating and managing regional governance practices in the areas of public health peace and security and microfinancial integration since 1975 there have been many failed and successful attempts at unconstitutional government changes in west africa during this same period numerous instruments have been designed to promote peace and security in the region this book examines the role of bureaucratic actors in the ecowas in harmonizing regional integration policy in west africa using data from fieldwork in several countries in west africa balogun observes how ecowas practitioners network and strategically engage regional stakeholders in health peace and security and finance as a means to deepen harmonization between ecowas member states and build a connection with civil society balogun argues

that the founding conditions of ecowas set the organization on an institutional path to adapt its approaches to regional governance region building in west africa challenges the idea that self interested leaders limit regional cooperation the book also challenges the idea that the bureaucrats in the organization are glorified servants to their governments region building in west africa instead focuses on the influence that bureaucrats have in shaping the international policy agenda of ecowas this book will be useful to scholars students and practitioners in africa and beyond who want to better understand the inner workings of african regional organizations and the processes that drive cooperation across west africa it is important for historians studying west africa before the people who live in the region west africa is home to several scores of tribes languages and dialects even though tribal cords are quite strong and languages may differ markedly even between two communities a few hundred miles apart it is usual to find similarities between the local folktales and in some cases only the names of the central characters would make one version of a tale to be different from another most of the stories in this volume were gleaned from areas within the countries now known as ghana and togo however the stories are commonly retold in several forms all over the west africa region originally published in 1978 as part of the urbanization in developing countries series this is an interdisciplinary study of rapid urban growth in west africa gugler and flanagan expanded at a fast pace in the years preceding publication this critical review of the disparate findings filled a gap in african studies and threw light on the understanding of third world urbanization the early collections from africa in liverpool s world museum reflect the city's longstanding shipping and commercial links with africa's atlantic coast a principal component of these to surviving narratives that accompanied their donations and within the context of broader processes of trans imperial exchange through which they forged new identities and statuses for themselves and attempted to counter expressions of british cultural imperialism in the region the study concludes with a discussion of the competing meanings assigned to the ridyard assemblage by the liverpool museum and examines the ways in which its re contextualization in museum contexts helped to efface signs of the energies and narratives behind its creation at a time when trade negotiations on cotton have been suspended the publication contends that with 16 million people in west african being dependent on cotton production the dialogue between developed and developing countries must continue and sets out a framework for discussions this 1971 book considers the part played by voluntary associations in the growth of towns in west africa the media and prevailing policy discourses convey an increasingly apocalyptic image of the massive outflows of desperate africans fleeing poverty and war at home this study tries to achieve a more empirically and quantitatively founded understanding of
